Update on Petition to Pittsboro Town Board to hold Chatham Park Investors Accountable

We have had overwhelming support for the petition we began circulating 3 weeks ago regarding Chatham Park Investors' proposal for a single, massive 5,000-acre "small area plan." We have collected over 800 signatures and will continue to collect signatures until we present the petition to the Pittsboro Planning Board at their meeting on Monday, July 21st at 6:00 pm at the Agricultural and Conference Center.
