Urgent action alert: MONDAY NIGHT IS THE NIGHT!!! PLEASE HELP US PACK THE ROOM!!!

Chatham Park Investors' huge Small Area Plan is back on the Board of Commissioners' agenda for their meeting **Monday night (November 10th)** - as always at 6pm **at the Ag Center**.

Despite the Planning Board's unanimous recommendation that the Board vote down the proposal, Town Staff are recommending that they pass it. There is a very high probability that they will get the votes to do that despite all the problems of the proposal and overwhelming public concern. And despite the fact that the 2 candidates most concerned about development issues in Pittsboro won the election by huge margins!

Please show up Monday night and spread the word as broadly as you can to get others to join us!

Deep River Park will host a Native American Gathering on Saturday, November 8, 2025, from 12:00 PM to 5:00 PM, featuring Native dancing, music, storytelling, food, and more to honor the first Americans and explore indigenous culture. The event is held at the Camelback Bridge in Deep River Park and requires an admission fee of \$10 for adults, with children 12 and under admitted free; all proceeds go to the upkeep of the park.

UPDATES and FOLLOW UP

Election results: Great news in Pittsboro! Both **Candace Hunziger** and **Tiana Thurber** won seats on the Pittsboro Board of Commissioners. Thanks to everyone who voted, volunteered, donated or talked with friends about voting for them.

The Pittsboro Board of Commissioners will vote on Monday, November 10th to adopt their draft [Climate Action Plan!](#)

The Chatham County Board of Commissioners, joined by members of the Climate Change Advisory Committee (CCAC), held the second day of their retreat focused on climate change. Topics included solid waste's contributions to greenhouse gases, financing climate action, community engagement and work on framing the vision and goals for a county climate action plan.. Next steps will be for the CCAC to propose the sectors in the overall framework and for Kevin Lindley, Sustainability Director, to gather information to draft a request for proposal to present to the BOC. The plan is to have information available to create a Climate Action Plan for Chatham County before the budgeting process begins. Many opportunities for community input will be forthcoming and we'll be sure you know about them..
