VOTE!

Municipal elections are underway for cities in Chatham County (even if you can't vote, encourage your friends in Pittsboro and Siler City to vote). Great news! The Sierra Club endorsed **Candace Hunziger** and **Tiana Thurber** in the Pittsboro election. From Town Commissioner John Bonitz, "Tiana and Candace have already distinguished themselves in a crowded field of candidates as the only two who are at nearly every Commissioners meeting and Planning Board meeting since they filed to run. Coincidentally, they've both personally endured impacts from stormwater flooding. And they also both bring impressive resumes of prior work experience. Most importantly, they share our values, and are driven by their hearts, with keen minds for the facts. I admire both Candace and Tiana for their passion and dedication to building Pittsboro's future the right way."

GIVE FEEDBACK AND INPUT

Chatham Park South Village Small Area Plan Proposal

Update Great news! At their meeting on 10/20, the Planning Board unanimously voted to urge the Pittsboro Board of Commissioners to stand firm on rejecting Chatham Park Investors' (CPI) proposal to substitute one massive plan in place of the 16 small area plans in the South Village originally proposed.

Survey We encourage you to give feedback to Pittsboro through this [survey](#) [hurry - the survey **closes on 10/29**] as they gather more input from the community on the small area plan, which will guide land use, transportation, utilities, parks and open space, environmental stewardship, and community character within the South Village area of Chatham Park. The survey invites residents, business owners, and stakeholders from

across Pittsboro and Chatham County to share their priorities, concerns, and ideas as the Board of Commissioners reviews and considers the draft plan. Critical issues to consider in giving feedback are: 1) preserving representative democracy / authority; 2) saving more farms and forests; 3) reducing future climate impact by growing compactly, with walkability and true "live-work-play".

Show up PBO Commissioners Meeting. Let's show up en masse Monday, November 10th when the Board of Commissioners weighs-in on the Chatham Park Investors Small Area Plan proposal at 6:00 pm at the Chatham Ag Center.

Move Chatham Chatham County is conducting a study and inviting public input to better understand perceptions of current choices and future needs for all modes of transportation—automotive, public transit, cycling, and walking. Transportation is the biggest emitter of climate pollution in Chatham and the US. This is hugely important for our climate! Insights from this effort will help shape a forthcoming planning initiative aimed at developing a long-term vision for multi-modal travel throughout Chatham County and connection to its neighbors. Native American Gathering November 8th Deep River Park Camelback Bridge. Deep River Park will host a Native American Gathering on Saturday, November 8, 2025, from 12:00 PM to 5:00 PM, featuring Native dancing, music, storytelling, food, and more to honor the first Americans and explore indigenous culture. The event is held at the Camelback Bridge in Deep River Park and requires an admission fee of \$10 for adults, with children 12 and under admitted free; all proceeds go to the upkeep of the park.

Chatham County Board of Commissioners joined by members of the Climate Change Advisory Committee held the first day of a 2 day retreat focused on climate change on October 17th. NEXT QUARTERLY GATHERING



NC WARN is a 37-year-old 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization tackling the accelerating crisis posed by climate change by building people power for a swift North Carolina transition to clean power, and by promoting energy and climate justice. Modest increases in energy efficiency, combined with local solar power and battery storage can allow the rapid phase-out of all gas- and coal-fired power plants in North Carolina. This shift is North Carolina's primary opportunity to help slow the accelerating climate crisis.
